<u>New Survey on Challenges, Solutions and Opportunities for Fighting Poverty through Management</u> <u>Education</u>

A new, global survey to characterize the current level of commitment by business program faculty to fighting poverty through management education is being prepared by Carole Parkes and Britta Kornbach, University of Winchester, UK. The new survey extends the WG's 2012 global survey on Challenges, Solutions and Opportunities and will be launched early in 2017. We hope to have preliminary results for the PRME Global Forum scheduled for July 2017 in New York.

<u>4th RME Research Conference, Curitiba, Brazil</u>

Our WG has been actively involved in the preparation of the 4th RME Research Conference to be held in September 2017 in Curitiba, Brazil. This event is being co-organized and hosted by PRME Regional Chapter-Brazil, UNDP-Brazil, and UN Global Compact Office-Brazil . Formal announcement of the 4th RME Conference will be been made at the 3rd RME Research Conference in Krems.

Ongoing Book Projects

The joint book project, which our WG has launched with the PRME Work Groups on Anti-corruption and Gender Equality, is progressing as scheduled. The first book, <u>Beyond the Bottom Line: Integrating UN</u> <u>Global Compact into Business Practice</u>, is schedule for year-end publication. A second book, <u>Redefining</u> <u>Success: Integrating UN Global Compact into Responsible Management Education</u>, is tentatively scheduled for Spring 2017 publication. WG members have chapters in both books.
