WG 2017 Annual Report and 2018 Outlook

Our WG Annual report for 2017 and Outlook for 2018 has been published and widely distributed through the PRME Newsletter earlier this month. Once again many thanks to all of you who contributed to the impressive quality and amount of work done!

Task Force on Anti-poverty Toolkit

The Task Force, consisting of Claudio Boechat (Brazil), Anastasiya Marcheva (Bulgaria), Shiv Tripathi (India), Martin Burt (Paraguay), Tay Keong Tan (USA), and the two undersigned WG co-chairs, are beginning their work on developing an Anti-poverty Toolkit. The Toolkit was identified as the number one priority during the 2016 Delphi Process involving working group members. The Task Force is planning an initial Skype meeting, to be followed up with a special webinar supported by the PRME Secretariat.

WG Symposium at EURAM 2018, Reykjavik Iceland, 20-23 June

Our WG Symposium on Impact and Action-Oriented Research on Poverty & the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), at EURAM 2018 will be held in a World Cafe format. Our colleagues Ginny Santiago, Ted London, Consuelo Garcia de la Torre and Martina Hutton have prepared inspiring questions on: business school curriculum design, student engagement, faculty research methods and technology that will be discussed at different roundtables. We also have prepared, in advance, some questions related to the findings of our WG global survey(s) and the books produced by or with the collaboration of our WG. Last but not least, the floor will be open for questions and inputs from all WG members who will attend the event. Anti-poverty WG tracks at the 5th RME Research Conference, 11-12 November, Cologne, Germany

As in the past, our Working Group is a co-sponsor and co-organizer of the 5th RME Research Conference, which will be held in conjunction with the 6th PRME Regional Chapter DACH Meeting and 8th International CSR and Responsible Leadership Conference in November in Cologne. Also, as is our tradition, the WG will propose poverty-related research and teaching sessions, will hold a WG Planning Session, will support cross-issue sessions in collaboration with other PRME Working Groups. The Call for Contributions will be published around 28 February on the conference home page and further distributed through the PRME Newsletter March.

<u>Global Survey on Students Perception and Views on the Issue of Poverty and the SDGs in Management</u> <u>Education</u>

A new project, designed to hear the voices of students and youth as they relate to the issue of poverty and the SDGs, is in its initial planning stage. This project is designed to complement last year's Global Survey of Faculty and Administrators on these same issues.

Joint Book Project

The deadline for the second book in the joint book project on the SDGs, <u>Struggles and Successes in the</u> <u>Pursuit of Sustainable Development</u> (Routledge, expected winter 2018/19) has been extended until <u>20</u> <u>March 2018</u>. We hope our WG members will use this publishing opportunity. Particularly welcome are contributions around the poverty and cross-related SDG issues in specific socio-economic and cultural contexts.

Anti-poverty WG referred to in the Gaidar Forum in Moscow

Jonas Haertle, Head of PRME Secretariat, made reference to the preliminary findings from our 2nd Global Survey on the Issue of Poverty and SDGs in Management Education during his <u>Gaidar Forum</u> presentation in Moscow, 16-18 January. His reference to the WG's Global Survey contributed to the promotion and visibility of our Working Group.

WG support of member activities and projects

International University Forum on the Value of Human Rights on the Camino de Santiago

Among more than 100 students from 20 universities in 14 countries who will participate in this project, there will be around 20 students from four institutions represented by our WG members (AUC-Egypt, CBS-Denmark, UDG-Montenegro and Ahfad University for Women -Sudan). One of the chapters in the four modules of the project (moderated by Milenko Gudić) is focused on PRME.
