Both events should give us a feeling of satisfaction for getting involved with one of the most pressing global concerns as well as for renewing our commitments to fight poverty through management education. This **PRME Anti-poverty Working Group Update October 2019** confirms that the momentum of our WG, its members and partners' engagement maintains its traditionally high level, while also contributing to the innovativeness and diversity of the activities that are being taken.

## <u>Recap: 6<sup>th</sup> RME Research Conference, 29 September – 3 October, Jönköping, Sweden</u>

The 6th RME Research Conference on "Multi-stakeholder Engagement for Achieving the SDGs and Agenda 2030," was a great success, from both the program and organizational point of view. It also was the main and only global gathering of the PRME community in 2019.

A pre-conference day consisted of individual WG and Regional Chapter sessions as well as Cross-WG and Cross-Regional Chapter sessions. Participants and guests learned about the great agility of the PRME community at the grass-root level. In the Cross PRME WG and Chapter session, our member **Tay Keong Tan** (USA, Singapore), briefed delegates on the initial results of the WG's Anti-poverty Toolkit, which attracted high attention and interest.

The roundtable on the *Shaping the Future of RME* provided for an exchange of views on the further developments of PRME, including those presented by the representatives of the PRME Advisory Committee (Carole Parkes and Milenko Gudić), representatives of different Regional Chapters (Norman Arruda Filho Regional Chapter Brazil and LAC), the consultant engaged by the UN Global Compact (Mette Morsing), and leaders and representatives of different international organizations and networks operating in the landscape of RME: GRLI (John North and Anders Aspling) ABIS (Ivo Matser), GBSN (Dan LeClair, SSDN (Florencia Librizzi), RRBM (Peter McKiernan), Sulitest (Jean Christophe Carteron), and Students for Sustainable Action (Susanne Merkler and Kjel Hendriks). This session focused on increasing RME impact by further strengthening mutual collaboration among various autonomous, independent and differently-focused and targeted networks.

Three WG members, **Guenola Nonet** (Sweden, France), **Lutz Schlange** (Switzerland) and **Milenko Gudić** (Serbia), served on the Conference Program Committee. Guenola <u>deserves special acknowledgement</u> as the masterful conference chair, who expertly integrated the conference with the Jönköping University Agenda 2030 Day and Sustainability Week in Jönköping. As the current School's Champion for sustainable development, Guenola further lifted a very high bar established by her predecessor, WG member **Marcela Ramirez-Pasillas**.

About one quarter of the close to 100 conference participants were WG members (from Brazil, Canada, China (including Hong Kong), Germany, India, Mexico, Malaysia, Portugal, Serbia, Singapore, Sweden, Switzerland, UK and USA), who were paper presenters, conference track and session chairs, moderators, and announcers of future RME research conferences. WG member **Ana Simoens** 

(Portugal) announced her institution's interst to host a future RME Research conference, which our WG will be responsible.

## **WG Anti-poverty Toolkit**

The panel on "Developing an Anti-Poverty Toolkit: Experiences and Lessons Learned", which was followed by the discussion on "How to Grow and Sustain the Anti-Poverty Toolkit as a Living Portal for Open Educational Resources," was especially interesting and interactive. Participants learned of the Toolkit's development by a student team from Radford University, USA (comprised of Emily Jenkins, Gabriel, Bennett, Haley Ninez and Lellie Molino, led by **Tay Keong Tan**) and of the more than 500 artifacts on poverty alleviation already uploaded into the toolkit for WG members' use.

**Emily Jenkins, Gabriel Bennett, Haley Nunez** and **Rachel Sharett** were all given WG **Special Awards** for Excellence in Research for the Anti-Poverty Toolkit to Facilitate Teaching and Research in Poverty Alleviation around the Globe.

## **Future RME conferences**

**Lisa Froelich**, Chair of the PRME Regional Chapter DACH, announced that the **7**<sup>th</sup> **RME Research Conference** will be held in 2020 in one of the DACH Chapter member schools, Switzerland. Exact conference dates and location will be announced shortly.

Following the model in which every second year the RME events are hosted by institutions of our WG members from different parts of the world, our WG member **Xuanwei Cao** (China) formally announced that the **8**<sup>th</sup> **RME Research Conference** will be held in 2021 in China at <u>International</u> Business School Suzhou (IBSS) at Xi'an Jiaotong-Liverpool University.
