2nd RME Research Conference

The <u>2nd</u><u>RME Research Conference on Inclusive Business</u> was held on 7-8 September at the American University in Cairo, Egypt. The conference drew more than 120 participants from around the world, including 11 Working Group Members from Bulgaria, Brazil, Egypt, France, Latvia, Pakistan, Peru, Serbia, Sudan, Switzerland and the USA. Working Group members contributed to different plenary panels and parallel research and teaching focused sessions on the issues of inclusive business, poverty and management education.

Responsible Management Education and the Challenge of Poverty: Teaching Perspective

A second book specifically developed to illustrate how to integrate poverty issues into management and business education will be published November 27, 2015 by Greenleaf Publishing. *Responsible Management Education and the Challenge of Poverty: Teaching Perspectives* is a collection of 16 chapters focused on poverty inclusion primarily in undergraduate and graduate/post-graduate courses. The book also includes chapters that describe different conceptual frameworks that bring additional insight into understanding and teaching about poverty. Twelve Working Group members contributed to the book.

Updated Delphi Survey

Over the past four years, much of the Working Group's work has been guided by a membership Delphi Survey (2011), which identified projects of most interest to the membership. We are planning another survey – to be readied in the new year -- aimed at collecting and discussing ideas and suggestions on the future work and engagement of the Working Group. Survey goals are to further improve the Working Groups thematic focus and work methods that support PRME initiatives on sustainable development, responsible management education, and implementation of the Sustain Development Goals and poverty alleviation.

Ongoing Publishing Projects

Two additional book projects will both have a focus on poverty and participation from Working Group members. The first book, *Beyond the Bottom Line: Integrating the UN Global Compact into Business Practice,* is a collaboration between the Poverty, Gender and Anti-Corruption Working Groups, and has a publication date of winter 2016/2017. The second book, *Redefining Success: Integration the UN Global Compact into Management Education,* is expected to be published spring 2017. Both books are published as part of the PRME/Greenleaf book series.

Sustainable Development Goals

The <u>Sustainable Development Goals</u> (SDGs) were adopted by all UN member states at the outset of the 70th session of the United Nations General Assembly in September. The SDGs replace the Millennium Development Goals (MGDs). Poverty continues to be Goal #1: ""End poverty in all its forms everywhere." SDG #1 supports the vision statement of the Working Group, which is to continue its work until "the issue of poverty is deeply embedded in all levels of management education worldwide."

Upcoming Conferences

The **3**rd **RME Conference** will be held on <u>19-21 October 2016 in Krems, Austria</u>. Our WG colleagues from Brazil announced their interest and willingness to host the 4th RME Conference in 2017 in Brazil.
