Our WG has been very active in the whole process. The two conference tracks proposed by our WG: <u>Conference track 03</u>: Action and Impact-Oriented *Research on Societal Impact and Poverty Alleviation through Entrepreneurship and Innovation* has **four accepted papers,** and <u>Conference track 04</u>: *Innovative Teaching and Learning Strategies that Develop Leadership Capabilities for Enhancing Societal Impact and Alleviating Poverty through Entrepreneurship and Innovation* also has **four accepted papers**. The three sessions chaired by our WG will have presentations of the papers from non-WG members.

As per tradition, the program includes the **Anti-poverty WG Planning Session**, where we will share information on the current activities carried out by WG members, as well as collect ideas, suggestions and proposals for future engagements. In addition, our WG coordinated the activities of a **Cross-WG Session** with the PRME Climate Change WG and PRME Sustainability Mindset WG. This session will explore ideas and modalities to further strengthen collaboration among these three PRME Working Groups and their respective stakeholders.

Last but not least, our WG will introduce the host institution of the jubilee 10th RME Research Conference in the closing session of the event and thus preview 2023's global RMER gathering.
