Here comes the Anti-poverty Working Group Update October 2020, which once again confirms the agility of our WG members and our WG as a whole in these challenging times.

7th Responsible Management Education Research Conference, Chur, Switzerland, 19-21 October

The 7th RME Research Conference on The Promise of Digitalization and Artificial Intelligence: Implications for Responsible Management Education and Moving forward with the SDGs, the event gathered more than 210 participants from all over the world. The event was co-organized and hosted by the University of Applied Sciences from Chur, Switzerland, where the 1st RMER conference took place in 2014.

Member's participating. Our WG, as per tradition, was very well represented, acting as presenters, track and session chairs, session moderators and/or speakers (including tracks and sessions not hosted by our WG). <u>Projects highlighted</u>. Several presentations referred also to *projects* that our WG conducted in recent years, including the WG Global Survey on Student Voices on the SDGs and the Issue of Poverty in Management Education (**Geri Mason** and **Al Rosenbloom**), Anti-poverty Toolkit (**Al Rosenbloom**, who presented the Toolkit as our WG "signature" project mentioned in the cross-association panel), joint book project on Global Champions of Sustainable Development (**Xuanwei Cao** and **Al Rosenbloom**), as well as our WG research and publishing activity in general (**Carole Parkes** as one of the panelists in the semi-plenary session on *Quo Vadis RME Research*. Extending the Boundaries of the RME Field.)

<u>Thematic contribution</u>. The WG provided leadership for and moderated a semi-plenary **conference panel** on *Building RME implementation Coalitions for Impact in the Decade of Action* that extended discussion of the first gathering of major players in the landscape of responsible management education, held as a WG initiative at the 6th RMER Conference, Jonkoping, Sweden. While presenting the "signature" projects and programs of their respective organizations and networks, which they offered for mutual sharing and collaboration, **Mathew Woods** (EFMD), **Dan LeClair** (GBSN), John North (GRLI), **Milenko Gudić** (PRME Anti-poverty WG), **Peter McKiernan** (RRBM) and **Florencia Librizzi** (SDSN) each acknowledged the practice of having a continuous dialogue at future RMER events to foster synergy during the Decade of Action.

As an echo to this, **GRLI** (Global Responsible Leadership Initiative) published on 29 October a series of three short blogs by **Milenko Gudić** that are based on his contribution to the ASCOLFA 2020 Annual Conference in August, including the section on the *need for a global RME pandemic*, which he presented as a context for the cross-association Coalition Building panel in Chur.

<u>2021 RMER Conference</u>: The event in Chur ended with the announcement of the **8**th **RMER Conference** that will be held <u>in 2021 in Suzhou, China</u>, where our WG member **Xuanwei Cao** has already started working on the preparatory and organizational activities.

Fostering horizontal collaboration with the PRME B4P Working Group

In line with our WG attempts to contribute to the horizontal collaboration and coalition building within PRME community and beyond, and following previous exchange of information and invitations, the chair and vice-chair respectively of the PRME Business for Peace (B4P) Working Group Christina Bache (Belgium) and Bob Sicina (USA) and our WG co-chairs Al Rosenbloom (USA) and Milenko Gudić (Serbia) had a virtual conference call on 9 October. The conclusions and recommendations of the call are summarized in the following points:

- The two working groups believe in the power of synergy making collaboration and suggest working together with their respective memberships.
- The two groups will regularly exchange information on their ongoing and future activities.

- In the near term, this will include posting relevant information, publications, calls and links on the respective WG B4P webpage and Anti-poverty Toolkit platform.
- The B4P WG will welcome 1-2 speakers from our WG to present their research to the B4P WG members in spring 2021.
- Longer-term, the two WGs agreed to explore possibilities of launching joint projects, involving research and publication, joint and collaborative sessions at the future responsible management education research conferences, PRME events and gatherings of other associations and organizations operating in the landscape of responsible management education.
- To engage our respective members, the two WG agreed to ask their members to come up with suggestions and ideas for further avenues and modalities for mutual collaboration.
- The two WGs will start exploring fundraising possibilities that could support joint research and other projects.
- The whole process will be monitored and facilitated by regular meetings between the two group's co-chairs.

Working Group Supporting Members' and Youth related projects

As a reminder the International Student Essay Competition organized by our WG member **Anastasiya Marcheva** and D.A. Tsenov Academy, Svishtov, Bulgaria, which is co-sponsored by our WG, has extended its deadline to <u>30 November</u>. The topic of this year's contest is <u>Youth Entrepreneurship – Current State, Problems, Opportunities.</u> On behalf of our WG, we particularly welcome contributions related to the role of youth entrepreneurship in poverty alleviation and the advancement of the SDGs.
