## WG in EURAM 2018, 20-23 June 2018, Reykjavik, Iceland

The WG's proposal for a Symposium session on "Impact and Action-Oriented Research on Poverty & the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)" was accepted for the EURAM 2018 Annual Conference, scheduled for 20-23 June 2018 in Reykjavik, Iceland. The Symposium will share with the EURAM community the main insights, outcomes and learning from the 10-year experience of our WG, as well as our views on the challenges and opportunities that are being faced with the implementation of the SDGs and 2030 Agenda.

WG members and colleagues **who have poverty-related research** are strongly encouraged to submit their proposals to <u>GT 14-The General Track</u> and <u>to highlight the focus on poverty in **the paper's title and keywords**. The General Track fits nicely with our collective interests in poverty: "*The idea is to empower researchers to explore the state of research and experiment with the aim of creating new insights. It is not just a question of methodology it is a quest for relevance in different disciplines of management. <u>The importance of impactful research is an effort to assist people to use the output of research to change behavior</u>." Deadline for paper submissions: 10 January 2018 - 2 pm Belgian time.</u>* 

### PRME Anti-poverty WG Toolkit

Work is starting on the development of the Anti-poverty Toolkit, ranked as the most important project for the WG during the three-round Delphi Survey. Several WG members identified themselves as champions of this important activity. ### <u>2<sup>nd</sup> Global Survey on the Issue of Poverty and the SDGs in Management Education</u>

To date, there have been 309 responses from 59 countries to the WG's 2<sup>nd</sup> Global Survey. Preliminary findings were presented at the PRME Global Forum held in New York in July, at the combined meeting of the PRME LAC (Latin American and Caribbean) and Brazil Regional Chapters, and the 4<sup>th</sup> RME Conference in Curitiba, Brazil. The survey team is now working on the publication of the Global Survey Report, which will appear in early 2018.

# 5th RME Research Conference Coordinates with Two November Meetings in Cologne, Germany

Our WG is the first to receive the information that the 5<sup>th</sup> RME Research Conference, which will be hosted by the Cologne Business School on 13 November 2018 in Cologne, Germany, will be <u>linked</u> with two other meetings. Participants in the 5<sup>th</sup> RME Research Conference will be able to participate in the PRME Regional Chapter DACH Annual Meeting on 11-12 November and the 8<sup>th</sup> Humboldt International Conference on Corporate Sustainability and Responsibility, on 14-15 November. ## Accomplished and On-going Joint Book Projects

The book <u>Redefining Success: Integrating Sustainability into Responsible Management Education</u> was published this October. The first book in the series of two books jointly produced by our WG and PRME Anti-corruption and Gender Equality, <u>Beyond the Bottom Line: Integrating sustainability into</u> <u>Business Practice</u>, was published in March 2017.

<u>Global Champions of Sustainable Development</u> is now in editorial review of proposal submissions. Chapter proposals for the next book, <u>Struggles and Successes in the Pursuit of Sustainable</u> <u>Development</u>, are due <u>1 March 2018</u>.
