Anti-poverty Toolkit Project

The 6th RME Research Conference in Jönköping, Sweden, formally launched the Anti-poverty Toolkit and at the conclusion of a robust panel presentation was officially handed over to the WG for continued development and maintenance. A separate message will provide WG members with both the Toolkit's web address and our next steps in its development.

Joint Book(s) Published

The book, <u>Global Champions of Sustainable Development</u>, was published in early December by Routledge. Our WG members have significantly contributed to the content and quality of this outstanding publication by (co)authoring six out of 13 book chapters. Al Rosenbloom (USA) coauthored the chapter What does it mean to be a Latin Family?: Achievements on sustainability of the Multi-Latina Grupo Familia; Ijeoma Nwagwu (Nigeria) wrote a chapter on Champions of sustainable development in Africa: challenges, successes and lessons learned in Nigeria; Diane Kellogg (USA) contributed the chapter on Champions of water and sanitation for all; Alec Wersun (UK) authored the chapter Champions of sustainable development: the university for the common good and Granmeen Caledonian College of Nursing in Bangladesh; Susan Kinne (Nicaragua) coauthored the chapter Paths to empowerment: a case study of local sustainability from rural Nicaragua; while Xuanwei Cao (China) co-authored the chapter Poverty eradication and political engagement; a case of sustainable entrepreneurship in China.

Our WG members **Tay Keog Tan** (USA, Singapore) and **Milenko Gudić** (Serbia) co-edited the book together with **Pat Flynn** (USA), the Co-chair of the PRME Gender Equality WG. Thanks and congratulations to all!

The twin book *Struggles and Successes in the Pursuit of Sustainable Development*, coedited by the same team will come out from press early next year.

A Series of SDG related Workshops in CEE
