In Memoriam: Mark Meaney

It is with sadness that we learned recently of Mark Meaney's passing away. Mark was one of the early pioneers and champions of PRME. Mark served along with WG member's **Milenko Gudić** (Serbia) **Carole Parkes** (UK) on the PRME Advisory Committee, whose charge was to provide insight and strategic advice to the Secretariat, including through the period in which the grass-root inititives and horizontal collaboration among PRME entities helped PRME go through the recently experienced governance crisis. Mark founded the PRME North American Chapter and led it with passion and creativity. Mark's wide and deep intellectual capacity, coupled with the highest personal integrity and ethical standards, made him stand as a firm moral compass. Those that knew Mark know of many talents and contributions. A voice and advocate for sound values in management education is now silent.

8th Responsible Management Education Research Conference, 19-22 October, Suzhou, China

- 1. To date, there have been 36 contributions from global scholars for the conference. For the two, special conference WG Tracks on poverty alleviation, prosperity, and responsible management education, there have been nine contributions to date.

- 3. Cross-working group collaboration is also evident in the conference's emerging program. Our WG has worked with the
 - PRME Business for Peace Working Group to co-sponsor a track on Business for Peace, Poverty
 Alleviation, Prosperity and Advancement of the SDGs and the 2030 Agenda along the One Belt One Road (OBOR) initiative in a Post-pandemic World.
 - PRME Sustainability Mindset Working Group to develop a sub-track within the conference
 - PRME Humanistic Management Working Group for a track that has a special focus on Latin America
- 4. Conference fee for online participation is \$US 50.

PRME Ambassadors, Latin America

The PRME Latin American and Caribbean Regional Chapter has developed an innovative program that engages emerging scholars throughout Latin America with the principles of PRME through direct engagement with PRME's various working groups. Al Rosenbloom (USA) represented our WG by giving a presentation to 12 Ambassadors on how to think more broadly about poverty, the implications of an expanded view of poverty, the role entrepreneurship plays in poverty alleviation and summary of the WG activities.
