Here is the **October 2018 update** on the ongoing and future activities of the PRME Anti-poverty Working Group.

Global Survey: Students Voice on the SDGs and Poverty in Management Education

Phase 1: The decision to extend the deadline for our global survey on students' views on the SDGs and the issue of poverty in management until the end of September turned out to be appropriate and fruitful. As a result, the survey has received 1005 responses from YY countries from around the globe. Thank you very much to all of you who contributed to this!

As you already know, the preliminary results of the survey will be presented at the 5th RME Research Conference in Cologne, Germany. We will come back to you with more information and some additional suggestions immediately after the event in Cologne.

Phase 2: Our new member from Poland, Marzena Starnawska, translated the survey questionnaire into Polish and is now widely distributing it in Poland. Based on several WG member's suggestion, we are keeping the survey open until the end of the year or January 2019. If you have not done so, please ask your students to participate.

Phase 3: Beginning in early 2019, we will undertake a deeper analysis of student views, particularly in terms of the qualitative answers.

Anti-poverty WG at the 5th RME Research Conference, 12-13 November, Cologne, Germany

Our WG is well represented at the conference, with around a dozen WG members having active roles in the event. Carole Parkes (UK) will chair a session on the cross-working group and cross-chapter collaboration that our WG proposed. In a plenary session of the main conference day, Al Rosenbloom (USA) and Anastasiya Marcheva (Bulgaria) will present the student survey results. Al Rosenbloom will chair the paper session on Responsible Management Education for SDG 1 Poverty Alleviation, while Claudio Boechat (Brazil) will co-lead the workshop on PRME Antipoverty Taskforce: Making SDG happen in an organization (and in the classroom). Anastasiya Marcheva (Bulgaria) will also present the results of her most recent student essay contest, whose theme was Leadership for the SDGs.
